Greater access to one to one support

The careers adviser has seen over 100 SPWT students and parents since September 2020. The careers hub has also launched in the library and is open for all students to book an appointment.

Insight into a broader range of career pathways

We have invited speakers and worked with mentors and employers from a range of backgrounds and industries such as, Finance, Private Equity, Medicine, Sports, Law/Law Enforcement, Accounting, Technology, Engineering, Art, Music and more.

More information and support on apprenticeships

We work with Amazing Apprenticeships to offer students with tailored apprenticeship support. We have also created bespoke apprenticeship programmes for Year 11, Year 12 and Year 13.

To understand the difference between BTEC and A-Level

Our students in Year 11 have access to a bespoke post-16 tutor time programme where they take part in activities, watch videos and hear from further education providers.

Access to external opportunities and work experience

We understand how important it is to have access to opportunities to learn about the world of work. During the pandemic, we have worked with a range of organisations, charities and employers to offer our students with the opportunity to undertake virtual work experience opportunities.

Access to a directory of college/sixth form and higher education institution

All students in Year 11 are provided with a careers pack that includes a list of colleges and sixth forms. They also have the opportunity to have a career interview. Students in Year 13 have access to higher education prospectuses and one to one interviews to support decision-making.
